In accordance with the City of Sarasota's Citizen Participation Plan and the requirements of the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD), the City is holding a 30-day comment period for a proposed substantial amendment to the 2024/2025 Annual Action Plan regarding the use of federal Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funding.

The proposed Substantial Amendment to the 2024/2025 Annual Action Plan will cancel an existing project titled, Old Bradenton Road Street Improvements Project, and reprogram CDBG funding to a new project, titled Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Memorial Park Improvements Project. After a comprehensive review, the City has determined that the street improvement project is no longer feasible based on the amount of CDBG funding available. The new park improvement project will fund playground equipment at Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Memorial Park located in Newtown.
